CCS Recruitment Initiative - June 30, 2009 to October 1, 2009

We are happy to report that both Preschool, ECS and Grade 1 classes for September 2009 are full!

Full classes mean more students reap the benefit of a Christ-centered education. Full classes also mean the cost to run the school is much lower. Some of our other classes, however, are not full. Empty seats raise costs.

In a school like CCS, it is important for us to all be involved. As parents, you understand the value of having your children enrolled in Calgary Christian School. Therefore, we are asking every parent to help strengthen the enrolment at CCS. We are pleased that many of you regularly refer and encourage your Christian friends to choose CCS for their children's education.

To encourage you further, we are having a Recruitment Initiative. We will award a referral family a \$500 Recognition of Recruitment for every referral from Grade 1 to Grade 12 that results in a new family's enrolment and student attendance at CCS.

5. \$500 recognition award can be applied to the referring family's Society Program Fees or donated to further the Mission and Vision of Calgary Christian School.

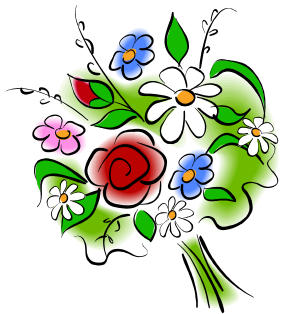

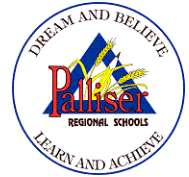

Student Supplies Required

Each student is expected to have the following school supplies. Hopefully, many items on each list can be found within the household or can still be used from last year.

TEACHERS REQUEST THAT ALL SUPPLIES BE BROUGHT IN SEPTEMBER, LABELED AND IN A LABELED ZIPLOC BAG

** We suggest Canadian made HB (NOT Eagle—the lead always breaks and the work can hardly be erased). Most "Fancy" pencils with a plastic coating do not sharpen in the pencil sharpener. Please check your glue sticks to see that they haven't dried out.

****Please sharpen pencils and pencil crayons before sending them to school with the students.**

**Please No Zip Up binders—they do not fit into the desks.

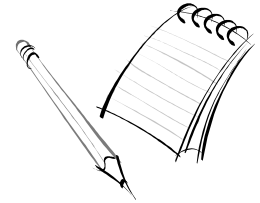

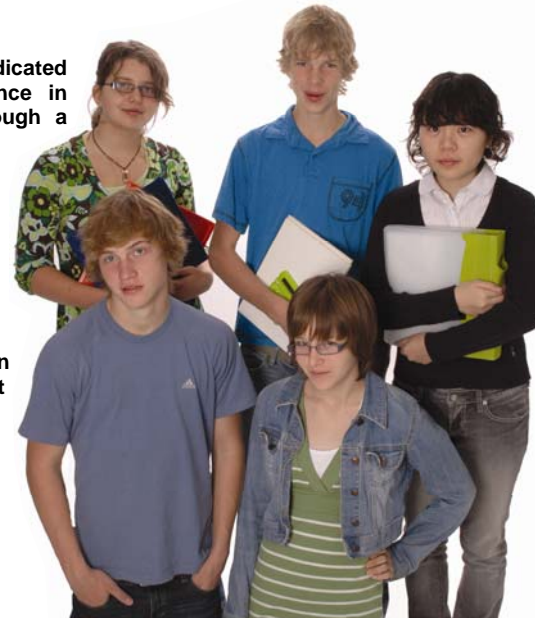
