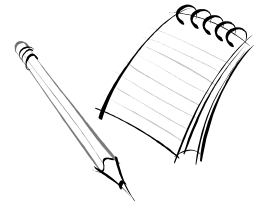

Teachers will advise of specific course material requirements during the first week of class.

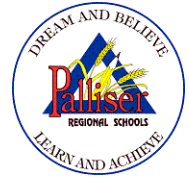
